

## Risk Assessment Camera Assistance duties

The people that might be harmed: Studioworks employees, contractors, public, artists

HAZARD	CONTROL
Awkward body positions and movements whilst undertaking the task.	Is using a camera assistant necessary.
Repetitive movements.	
Danger of electric shock from damaged cables or equipment.	Follow safe manual handling procedures.
<ul> <li>Danger of cables snagging, causing scenery or equipment to be pulled.</li> <li>over, equipment to be dropped and/or personal injury.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Check all cables and equipment for mechanical damage. Ensure that mains powered equipment and cables have been PAT (Portable Appliance Test) tested and comply with the EAW</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Uneven surfaces or changes in level creating tripping hazards.</li> <li>Poor or uneven lighting creating tripping hazards.</li> </ul>	(Electricity at Work) regulations. Mains supply cables should be connected via a RCD (residual current device) where available.
Risk of falling when working at height.	
<ul> <li>Increased risk of personal injury after prolonged periods of working.</li> </ul>	Take care with cable routing and ensure adequate slack cable.
<ul> <li>Increase in risk of injury as the weight of the camera and equipment increases.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Recce the site. Plan and risk assess the route. Account for possible unrehearsed moves or changes of position.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Extremes of temperature causing additional tiredness and/or muscle strain.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Work areas from which there is a risk of falling should have safe access and egress and conform to 'working at height' regulations.</li> </ul>

• High ambient sound levels. Be aware of the increased risk of physical injury, such as muscle Risk of injury to those who have a pre-existing medical condition strain, due to tiredness. Ensure adequate rest breaks are or are pregnant. provided and taken. Keep camera and equipment weight to the minimum. Avoid carrying too many items at the same time. Wear suitable clothing for the environmental conditions. Use suitable, approved noise-reducing headphones. Do not undertake a task if you believe that you will risk injury by doing so.
